LEGAL NOTICE 175 of 2005.

1. (1) The title of these regulations is the Model Phytosanitary Certificates Regulations. Title and scope.

(2) The scope of these regulations is to transpose the provisions found in European Commission Directive 2004/105 determining the models of official phytosanitary certificates or phytosanitary certificates for re-export accompanying plants, plant products or other objects from third countries and listed in Council Directive 2000/29/EC, which has been transposed as Plant Quarantine (Harmful Organisms) Regulations. S.L. 433.03

2. (1) For the purposes of Article 13(1)(ii) of Directive 2000/29/EC, the Director shall accept official “phytosanitary certificates” or “phytosanitary certificates for re-export” (certificates) accompanying plants, plant products or other objects listed in Part B of Annex V to Directive 2000/29/EC coming from contracting third countries to the International Plant Protection Convention (IPPC) which are issued in accordance with the models as specified in Schedule I. Criteria for acceptance of phytosanitary certificates.

(2) The Director shall only accept the certificates referred to in subregulation (1) provided that they have been completed taking into account the FAO International Standard for Phytosanitary Measures No 12 on Guidelines for phytosanitary certificates.

(3) Malta shall accept certificates issued in accordance with the models as specified in Schedule II, until the 31st December, 2009.
