

## Regional priorities

In line with the FAO Strategic Framework and NENA countries programming frameworks (CPFs)

Near East Regional Conference (Three regional initiatives adopted by the 32<sup>nd</sup> RC):

- Water scarcity
- Resilience for food security and nutrition
- Small-scale agriculture



## Scope:

The objective of SSA is to support countries in reducing rural poverty through a cohesive program addressing small-scale agriculture development.

### Rationale for intervention:

- Rural vs urban poverty
- Major source of income
- Social safety net
- Migration and mobility
- Gender and youth





### The Challenge:



SSA is the major source of income in rural areas in the NENA region, not only for smallholders themselves but within the rural economy, as a whole through the creation of farm and off-farm employment. However, inequality and rural poverty has increased over time in most countries in the region, due in part to neglect of SSA.



### The Response:

- Improving the understanding of various types of smallholders.
   (i.e. typology)
- II. Sustainably improving productivity, quality, value addition, social sustainability and viability of the sector. (FFS example: strengthen IPM, OP, etc.; sustainability and viability)
- III. Empowering small holders engaged in agriculture, forestry and fisheries, including strengthening professional organizations and supporting the creation of decent rural employment opportunities for youth and women. (FFS example: beyond IPM and production...business farmer field schools, issues of gender, governance...)



### Focus Areas of Work (summary):

- Support governments, producer organizations and rural institutions promoting capacity development tools on governance, sustainability and equity
- II. Support development of value chains and market linkages and improve access to sustainable rural services
- III. Support to strengthen producers' capacities, raise awareness of their priorities and create decent employment opportunities.



### FFS from agricultural extension to adult education

- FFS are a bottom-up participatory approach that aim to empower farmers and improve agricultural outcomes;
- Since FAO first introduced FFS in Indonesia in 1989, FFS have reached over 12 million farmers in more than 90 countries;
- FFS have empowerment objectives, as well as objectives related to agricultural production.



### Technologies incorporated in FFS

- IPM 54%
- Other pesticide management 19%
- IPPM / ICPM 11%
- Others 16%





### FFS and Small-Scale Agriculture (SSA)

#### SSA:

- provides 80% of agricultural production in NENA
- Is the major source of income in rural areas of NENA
- Farmers dependent on agriculture and livestock for their livelihoods are highly exposed to risks and are more vulnerable
- Is a key for reduction of rural poverty

**FFS** represent a powerful and effective approach to assist SSA





- ✓ FFS is tailored for small-scale farmers to access to information and practice
- ✓ Platform for meeting farmers needs in different local contexts
- √ Farmers are becoming experts, more resilient to changes and challenges
- ✓ Improve quality of the production (food safety inclusiveness)
- ✓ Development of other skills as entrepreneurial, marketing, savings, etc.
- ✓ FFS, IPM and small-scale farmers: towards sustainable natural resources management and environmental protection





FFS approach is an important step forward in agricultural education and extension, it increases the capacity, knowledge and skills of small-scale farmers.
